In these 19,062 families there were 44,473 recipients, including 34,354 children, who received payment. The average monthly payment was \$82.96 per recipient.

FAMILY ASSISTANCE

Payments by the Department for child care of children totaled \$7,115,858.37 for 30,193 children for the month of April. This included payments totaling \$6,318,859.39 for 25,654 children in Licensed Child Care Centers, \$655,832.71 for 3,093 children in Family and Group Day Care Homes, and \$141,166.27 for 1,446 children in Informal Care. The average monthly payment per child was \$235.68.

The maximum board payment from the Department is based on the age of the child and is as follows: 0-2 years, \$410.00; 3-5 years, \$423.00; 6-12 years, \$434.00; and 13-18 years (19 if last year in high school), \$446.00. The average board payment per month may be less than the maximum because some of the children included have board payments made partially from private funds and because some children do not remain at board for a full month. In some instances the average board payment may exceed the maximum because certain children are eligible for nursing care or special care.

The average board payment per month may be less than the maximum because some of the children included have board payments made partially from private funds and because some children do not remain at board for a full month.
