In these 19,052 families there were 44,417 recipients, including 34,333 children, who received payment. The average monthly payment was \$83.39 per recipient.

**FAMILY ASSISTANCE**

Payments by the Department for child care of children totaled \$6,360,939.21 for 30,012 children for the month of February. This included payments totaling \$5,614,160.07 for 25,306 children in Licensed Child Care Centers, \$608,996.59 for 3,181 children in Family and Group Day Care Homes, and \$137,782.55 for 1,525 children in Informal Care. The average monthly payment per child was \$211.95.

**SOCIAL SERVICES**

Children receiving payment from the Foster Care Maintenance Payments program provided through County Departments of Human Resources numbered 1,362 for the month of February. The maximum board payment from the Department is based on the age of the child and is as follows: 0-2 years, \$410.00; 3-5 years, \$423.00; 6-12 years, \$434.00; and 13-18 years (19 if last year in high school), \$446.00. The average board payment per month may be less than the maximum because some of the children included have board payments made partially from private funds and because some children do not remain at board for a full month. In some instances the average board payment may exceed the maximum because certain children are eligible for nursing care or special care.

## SOCIAL SERVICES

Children receiving payment from the Aid to Children in Foster Care program provided through County Departments of Human Resources numbered 2,490 for the month of February. The maximum board payment from the Department is based on the age of the child and is as follows: 0-2 years, \$410.00; 3-5 years, \$423.00; 6-12 years, \$434.00; and 13-18 years (19 if last year in high school), \$446.00. The average board payment per month may be less than the maximum because some of the children included have board payments made partially from private funds and because some children do not remain at board for a full month. In some instances the average board payment may exceed the maximum because certain children are eligible for nursing care or special care.
