A total of 18,744 families with dependent children with an average of 2.31 recipients per case received payments averaging \$192.49 for the month of June. In these 18,744 families there were 43,328 recipients, including 33,463 children, who received payment. The average monthly payment was \$83.27 per recipient.

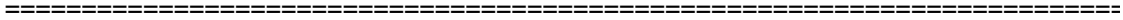

FAMILY ASSISTANCE

Payments by the Department for child care of children totaled \$8,077,352.61 for 29,547 children for the month of June. This included payments totaling \$7,224,397.34 for 25,210 children in Licensed Child Care Centers, \$699,053.26 for 2,981 children in Family and Group Day Care Homes, and \$153,902.01 for 1,356 children in Informal Care. The average monthly payment per child was \$273.37.
