FAMILY ASSISTANCE

Payments by the Department for child care of children totaled \$6,071,951.41 for 27,292 children for the month of October. This included payments totaling \$5,409,820.32 for 23,347 children in Licensed Child Care Centers, \$534,840.75 for 2,659 children in Family and Group Day Care Homes, and \$127,290.34 for 1,286 children in Informal Care. The average monthly payment per child was \$222.48.

The emphasis of the new law is on work activities and employment of recipients. Child care and other supportive services are available to participants.
