A total of 20,756 families with dependent children with an average of 2.36 recipients per case received payments averaging \$192.23 for the month of January. In these 20,756 families there were 48,957 recipients, including 37,033 children, who received payment. The average monthly payment was \$81.50 per recipient.

**FAMILY ASSISTANCE**

Payments by the Department for child care of children totaled \$6,142,553.44 for 27,189 children for the month of January. This included payments totaling \$5,536,853.92 for 23,549 children in Licensed Child Care Centers, \$497,608.14 for 2,486 children in Family and Group Day Care Homes, and \$108,091.38 for 1,154 children in Informal Care. The average monthly payment per child was \$225.92.

**SOCIAL SERVICES**

Children receiving payment from the Foster Care Maintenance Payments program provided through County Departments of Human Resources numbered 1,499 for the month of January. The maximum board payment from the Department is based on the age of the child and is as follows: 0-2 years, \$410.00; 3-5 years, \$423.00; 6-12 years, \$434.00; and 13-18 years (19 if last year in high school), \$446.00. The average board payment per month may be less than the maximum because some of the children included have board payments made partially from private funds and because some children do not remain at board for a full month. In some instances the average board payment may exceed the maximum because certain children are eligible for nursing care or special care.

**SOCIAL SERVICES**

Children receiving payment from the Aid to Children in Foster Care program provided through County Departments of Human Resources numbered 2,494 for the month of January. The maximum board payment from the Department is based on the age of the child and is as follows: 0-2 years, \$410.00; 3-5 years, \$423.00; 6-12 years, \$434.00; and 13-18 years (19 if last year in high school), \$446.00. The average board payment per month may be less than the maximum because some of the children included have board payments made partially from private funds and because some children do not remain at board for a full month. In some instances the average board payment may exceed the maximum because certain children are eligible for nursing care or special care.
