FAMILY ASSISTANCE

Payments by the Department for child care of children totaled \$7,530,658.79 for 27,776 children for the month of July. This included payments totaling \$6,862,400.50 for 24,295 children in Licensed Child Care Centers, \$536,401.88 for 2,339 children in Family and Group Day Care Homes, and \$131,856.41 for 1,142 children in Informal Care. The average monthly payment per child was \$271.12.

SOCIAL SERVICES

Children receiving payment from the Foster Care Maintenance Payments program provided through County Departments of Human Resources numbered 1,674 for the month of July. In some instances the average board payment may exceed the maximum because certain children are eligible for nursing care or special care.
