FAMILY ASSISTANCE

Payments by the Department for child care of children totaled \$7,729,955.15 for 30,474 children for the month of August. This included payments totaling \$7,082,623.83 for 26,950 children in Licensed Child Care Centers, \$528,519.13 for 2,431 children in Family and Group Day Care Homes, and \$118,812.19 for 1,093 children in Informal Care. The average monthly payment per child was \$253.66.
