#### FAMILY ASSISTANCE

Payments by the Department for child care of children totaled \$6,246,698.18 for 34,415 children for the month of February. This included payments totaling \$5,292,074.02 for 27,549 children in Licensed Child Care Centers, \$784,395.93 for 4,816 children in Family and Group Day Care Homes, and \$170,228.23 for 2,050 children in Informal Care. The average monthly payment per child was \$181.51.
