FAMILY ASSISTANCE

Payments by the Department for child care of children totaled \$7,590,164.14 for 35,853 children for the month of June. This included payments totaling \$6,498,148.41 for 28,934 children in Licensed Child Care Centers, \$874,825.70 for 4,685 children in Family and Group Day Care Homes, and \$217,190.03 for 2,234 children in Informal Care. The average monthly payment per child was \$211.70.
