A total of 20,363 families with dependent children with an average of 2.34 recipients per case received payments averaging \$186.42 for the month of November. In these 20,363 families there were 47,717 recipients, including 36,026 children, who received payment. The average monthly payment was \$79.55 per recipient.

FAMILY ASSISTANCE

Payments by the Department for child care of children totaled \$7,268,800.44 for 29,496 children for the month of November. This included payments totaling \$6,642,547.87 for 26,108 children in Licensed Child Care Centers, \$531,517.40 for 2,364 children in Family and Group Day Care Homes, and \$94,735.17 for 1,024 children in Informal Care. The average monthly payment per child was \$246.43.
