If the child exceeds therapeutic care and needs intensive care, 60-90 days is a long time for the child to wait for intensive.</p>	<p>Full review of RFP is needed; section 3.5</p> <p>Full review of RFP; section 3.0 Anticipated length of stay 60-90 days dependent on the unique situation of each youth, the length of stay may be shorter or longer.</p>

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			Currently, state-level DHR has been clear with the county that if the provider reports that placement isn't working, the county <u>must</u> come pick up the child; it is truly an emergency respite. What happens if a placement is not working, and the youth needs to be removed from the placement?	This is not emergency respite. This is an assessment program. Vendor must be able to provide recommendations for services, treatment modalities, level of placement, intervention, education, medical, etc. to meet needs of child/youth. Same process for removal applies.
6	3.0	Scope of Project	The RFP states, "Discharge requests based on the youth's maximization of benefits of the program should not occur."	This is correct.
7	3.0	Scope of Project	Typically, Emergency Placements provide shelter only, not treatment. Are providers expected to offer treatment during placement?	Yes this is not emergency – this program is stabilization so the child can stabilize and determine appropriate level of care for next placement.
